Currently, there are approximately 76.4 million baby boomers living in the United States (Population Reference Bureau, 2018). Since the beginning of 2011, 10,000 baby boomers have been turning 65 years old EVERY DAY and this will continue through the year 2030 (Pew Research, 2010).

People are living longer than ever before in American history (University of Southern California, 2018). Even though people are living longer, they are not necessarily healthier. According to a study published in JAMA Internal Medicine, they are seeing higher rates of obesity, hypertension, and diabetes (JAMA Internal Medicine, 2013). According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, healthcare and social assistance jobs are expected to increase by nearly 4 million in the United States (US Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2017).
